We purchased 10 robotics kits this past summer and plan to use them in conjunction with another addition to our curriculum. Mr. Thooft heads up our technology department and will be teaching grades 1-5 robotics and grades 6-8 coding. Most teachers will also gradually begin to use our new Chrome Books with their regular classroom instruction. Each year we hope to dig deeper and deeper into technology usage for all students.

Kindergarten: The Kindergarten children have been working hard and are adjusting to being big kids. They especially enjoy being able to play on the big slides and monkey bars at recess. This past week, we learned how the angel Gabriel came and told Mary she was going to be the mother of Jesus. We also learned about the birth of John the Baptist. We began Letter book C and met our first Superkid named Cass. We also learned placement words like top, middle, and bottom. We are also working on identifying the hard c sound /k/ at the beginning of words. We have also been working on our small motor skills like holding a pencil properly, cutting with scissors, and writing our names on a line. In Math, we began our chapter on numbers 0-5. We learned the words "match" and "set" along with the number words "one" and "two". We also learned how to count sets of objects with 1 or 2 things in them. In Science, we studied words that describe the weather. This week we will be having Show-n-Tell on Wednesday. Please bring something that begins with the hard sound of C like in cat or that is the color red. I have set up our first field trip of the year. We will be going to Johnson's Pumpkin Farm on Thursday, September 27 with the 3 yr. old preschool class. Please return the permission slip and money to school by Monday, September 17. Book order forms have also been sent home. Please place your order online or return the orders to school by Friday, September 21.

Our annual Family Fun Night will also be taking place on Thursday, September 27. This is for Bethel students and their families in grades Pre-3 through Grade 2. More information will be sent home soon.

Grades 1-2: We have had a fun first week of school! The children are quickly picking up our routines and getting used to first and second grade. We took our diagnostic math test this week and have started our Super Kids review. We have learned 3 different learning stations- read to self, word work, and computers. We will continue to practice these routines this week, as well as learn a few more. We will also be starting our math textbooks on Monday. Please look for your child's home binder to come home today. It will contain important information about what we are learning, especially Memory Treasures.

Grades 3-5: It was a great first week in the 3-5th grade classroom last week. We are continuing to settle into the routines and this week we will really be working to nail those down. On Wednesday, the students have hymn #478 With the Lord Begin Your Task due. On Thursday, Spelling unit 1 is due and we will have our first Spelling test of the year. On Friday, Memory Work is due. 4-5th graders will have a quiz on the Great Lakes this week for Michigan History. As we continue to settle into our class routines, please help your child stay on top of their daily and weekly work. Blessings on your week!

Grades 6-8: The first few weeks of school are often a bit crazy, there is a lot to get used to; there are often interruptions for unexpected events, and its hard getting into a routine. I hope this week is more like normal. I enjoyed my first week with my new classroom and look forward to a great year. My students seem eager to learn and have been very cooperative. I am trying to gradually build up so as not to overwhelm anyone. There are also many schedule changes when compared to last year. It should make for an exciting year. The go to place for information about what is going on daily in my room is Engrade! assignments will be posted almost immediately and grades for the day are usually posted before I go I often post larger assignments early so everyone has time to work ahead. Please watch for several notices coming home soon. Our class will be going to the River of Time in Bay City and also Cardinal for a Day at MLS. Please watch for future information and please volunteer to drive!
